Tuesday 12 October

Students have made a positive start to the new academic year; settling well into the new timings of the day and looking extremely smart in their uniforms.

We are continuing to upload work and resources onto Microsoft Teams to support any students who may have to self-isolate. Where students are off, they are able to login and access their lesson resources from home. Students can log into Teams using their school email/password through the Microsoft Teams app (on a phone/tablet/computer) or through a web browser. This will then give them access to resources to catch-up on missed lessons, or to check their homework tasks. If absent students have issues logging on at home, they can contact the school office for support.

We are delighted that our extra-curricular timetable has now been launched to students and we have a wide range of enrichment opportunities (both at lunchtimes and after school) that students can take part in. After a year-long closure (due to Covid-19), we are also pleased to welcome students back into the school's Learning and Resource Centre (LRC). The LRC is open at breaktimes for reading, as well as lunchtimes and after-school (on Monday and Thursdays until 5pm) for students to loan books, read, or use the space to study independently.
