We hope that you all managed to have a restful break over the May half term. Since lockdown commenced, although school has been closed for most students, we have been operating each day onsite, to care for our critical worker students and our routines for this group are now well-established. Following the Department of Education's guidance to 'offer some face-to-face support to supplement the remote education of Year 10 and Year 12 students who are due to take key exams next year', we have been undertaking significant discussions, risk assessment and planning to ensure we are able to do this safely from Monday 15 June. We have now written to parents of students in Year 10 and Year 12 to explain our plans for a phased reopening to offer some face-to-face teaching for these year groups.

Thank you to all parents who have provided feedback on the online platform. We are committed to further developing the way we set work online to ensure that we are supporting all students working from home as best we can. We will continue to update you as the online platform evolves.

Year 12 Information

• We are looking forward to providing face-to-face support to all our Year 12 students from 15 June. A detailed letter, outlining how we will be offering safe face-to-face specialist teaching from this date is available here, alongside a copy of the Year 12 timetable.

Year 10 Information

- We are looking forward to providing face-to-face support to our Year 10 students from 15 June, on a phased basis, to supplement remote learning. Students will have access to specialist teaching in the core subjects of English, maths and science, alongside a comprehensive tutor programme. Personalised letters have been posted home with full details of dates in school, pod number, location and arrival times and a generic version of the letter can be accessed here.
- All Year 10 students have been issued with 'Log On Move On' accounts. This careers gateway is a single source of information and resources and can be retained and used until Year 14. A video introduction to these resources can be accessed here.
- We had been planning to offer a further maths GCSE in year 10, in addition to the usual options choices. However, a communication has been sent out to anyone who had expressed interest in this subject as, regrettably, we do not feel it would be beneficial for our students to be studying an additional qualification at this difficult time.

Year 9 Information

- We have been delighted to confirm GCSE option choices for all our Year 9 students and a personalised confirmation has been provided to all students. A generic version of the letter can be accessed here. Now that we have confirmed your son or daughter's options, based on parental feedback, we have made some changes to the way we are setting work on the online platform. We would now like to ask all Year 9 students to complete and submit work for the subjects they will be studying for their GCSE options.
- We have also provided an updated 'Student Guide for Managing Workload' which includes a suggested timetable that may help students in managing their GCSE transition work submissions.

Year 7 & 8 Information

- In place of the annual creative writing categories at Driffield Show, Year 7 and Year 8 students are
 invited to enter a creative writing competition through their English tasks, using their learning from
 across the year. Winners will receive an Amazon voucher, as well as being published in the Driffield and
