

Careers Update - March 2021

British Science Week 5 March - 14 March 2021

We have celebrated British Science Week during our morning form programme. Students are aware of the many fantastic careers available in science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM). Out of the top ten highest earning degree subjects, seven are science based with an average earning potential of £40,000 after just 4 years after graduation. In the past ten years STEM jobs have grown three times faster than jobs in other sectors. The government is investing £180 million pounds to create 50,000 more apprenticeships, including in STEM. Students must also be aware that a graduate on average earns more than £160,000 more than a non-graduate, but a student graduating with a STEM degree on average will earn more than £250,000 more than a non-graduate. It is predicted that there will be over 500,000 new STEM jobs in the UK over the next five years.
