It has been great to welcome students back into school after their Easter holidays and it has been a positive start to the summer term. This is a very busy half term for our Year 11 and Year 13 students, who are currently undertaking a number of post-Easter assessments. Full School Information

- A key element of our behaviour for learning policy is around rewarding students for their hard work and meeting our high expectations. Unfortunately, due to COVID restrictions, the school shop has been closed. We are just in the final planning stages of re-opening it and students will be informed of their total reward points from the 2019-20 academic year in the coming weeks. Students will have access to an online click and collect service where they can purchase items including stationery, sporting equipment or Amazon/High Street vouchers. Once this process has finished, the school shop will remain open for this current academic year, also using a click and collect service.
