National Citizen Service

Year 11 and 12 parents or carers have received a letter regarding the fantastic National Citizen Service.



The NCS programme offers young people, aged 16-17, a once in a lifetime opportunity to do something meaningful with their summer break, as well as a chance to develop their employability skills and take on new challenges that will set them up for adult life. They will make a difference in their local community, and carry out a project to support a cause they care about. Over a period of 2 or 3 weeks, students who take part in the NCS will:

- Meet new people
- Try new things
- Give back to their local community through voluntary action
- Take on new challenges
- Develop the skills and confidence to take on their next steps
- Generate experience for their university application, job/apprenticeship interview or CV and more!

A place on the NCS is worth around £1500. However, thanks to government funding for the programme, the NCS will only ask for a contribution of £50 to cover some basic costs. We want to ensure that everyone can complete the NCS so there are bursaries available if you need some help to cover the cost.

This summer, the start dates that you can choose are:

- 12th July- (3 week programme including 1 week away residential- Monday to Friday)
- 26th July (3 week programme including 1 week away residential Monday to Friday)
- 9th August (2 week programme- Non Residential) - Based at the KCOM Stadium
- 16th August (2 week programme- Non Residential- Based at the KCOM Stadium.

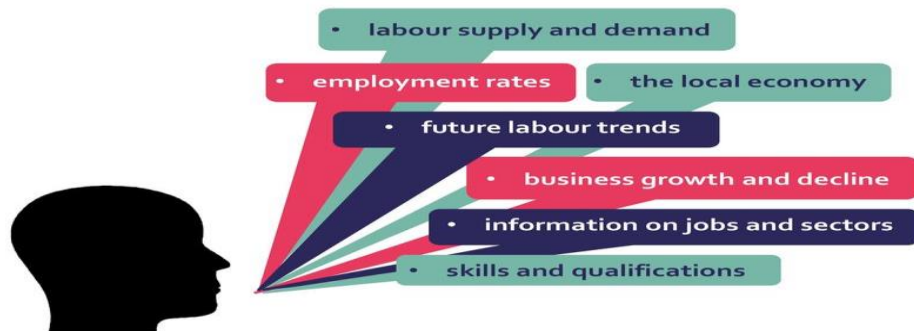
