#### Full School Information

- Detailed key information for the start of the new term has been sent out this week and this
  includes: timings of the school day for September; lateral flow test arrangements; first day
  arrangements; pastoral arrangements and uniform requirements.
- The CEIAG team wish all parents, carers and students a fabulous summer and have produced some useful guides on apprenticeships, post-16 options, University applications and University and degree apprenticeships. There's also a podcast and useful Shape Your Future booklet, explaining the different qualification levels, routes and training pathways.

- Details of the annual nasal flu vaccination programme from the East Riding Immunisation Team have been shared. From September 2021, the annual vaccination programme has been introduced for all secondary school students up to - and including - Year 11. The programme is strictly an 'opt in' service so please keep an eye out for future information.
- Further information on COVID-19 in school has been shared with you earlier this month, including details of contact tracing, controls and future plans. We have also sent out an update on contact tracing for step 4 Onwards and a guidance document giving an overview of the changes, key questions and further support available.
- We have explained the process for lateral flow testing in September for asymptomatic cases of COVID-19 for students. Full details are available, including: giving consent, accessing an appointment, as well as frequently asked questions.
