As we near the end of term, we would like to commend students for engaging so positively in their lessons. It is a real privilege to see them working so hard in lessons and also enjoying the extra-curricular opportunities available to them.

Our Year 11 students have received their mock result estimates and are now working on their feedback from their teachers. Period 6 sessions have been extremely well attended; 174 Year 11 students have accessed 1397 hours of consolidation lessons within the first four weeks of our period 6 programme and 70% of the cohort are attending more than one period 6 session every week. We are immensely proud of how hard they are working towards their examinations. We would also like to thank our staff for giving so freely with their time as they support students in the run up to their examinations.

We are looking forward to World Book Day when we return after half term on Thursday 3 March. Our events in school will include:

- A story across the day (with a different section being read to students in each lesson across the day at Key Stage 3).
- The Masked Reader competition in form time for all year groups, with prizes for the form groups that can correctly guess which teachers are our 'Masked Readers'.
- Teachers sharing their favourite books with their classes.

The book fair will also be in the LRC from Tuesday 1 March until Monday 7 March. All students will be able to buy books from the LRC and Years 7, 8 and 9 will have a slot in their English lessons to visit the book fair. All students will receive a £1 voucher that can be spent at the book fair. All purchases will need to be paid for with cash, though students can reserve titles if they don't have money at the time.

Full School Information

- We have shared with you the latest government guidance in relation to Covid-19 and, whilst staff
 and students will no longer be expected to wear masks (although they are welcome to if they
 wish), we continue to remind you of our continuing control measures, including good hygiene,
 increased ventilations, one-way systems and an extensive cleaning programme throughout the
 day. Please continue to take regular LFT tests at least twice every week and remember students
 must stay off school and take a PCR test immediately if any of the main symptoms of coronavirus
 are evident.

Year 11 and Year 13 Information

- The intention and expectation of the government is that GCSE and A level exams will go ahead as planned in the summer. As part of the contingency planning (in the unlikely event that the exams do not go ahead as planned), we have been asked by the government to collate evidence of what students have learned through in-school assessments for each subject. This evidence would then be used as part of any 'Teacher Assessed Grades' process, if required. Full details and dates can be accessed via this link...
- We have written to students in Year 11 and 13 regarding the advance information for GCSEs and A levels that the exam boards released on Monday 7 February. Please see further information using this link.
- All Year 11 and 13 students are able to access a full programme of after school 'Period 6' consolidation lessons to support them in preparation for their examinations. Transport is available and bus tickets are available from ACE reception. Students have also been provided with a £50 allocation to purchase revision materials and students have now been given their books to support them with their revision at home.
- Year 11 reports have now been shared with parents and carers. If you do have any subject-specific queries, please contact your child's class teacher and, for any pastoral support, please contact your child's Head of Year.
- Year 11 have one final set of mock exams after February half term in English language (Tuesday 1 March) and maths (Thursday 3 March). These examinations will not be used as part of any TAG process but staff will use these to identify any gaps in knowledge, misconceptions and to inform core interventions
- The shop is now open for Year 11 leavers' hoodies and the deadline for any orders is 20 February 2022.
