As we hit the midpoint of another busy half term, we would like to commend our exam groups on their positive work ethic; they continue to work extremely hard towards their examinations. 174 Year 11 students have accessed 2610 hours of consolidation lessons within the eight weeks that the programme has been running and more than 70% of the cohort continue to attend these sessions on a weekly basis. We continue to be immensely proud of them and look forward to seeing many of our Year 11 students who have signed up to attend our Steps to Success event, with their parents and carers, next Thursday 24 March.

We would like to thank Mrs Snowden and Mrs Mills for running the book fair earlier this month. Due to the amount that students spent at the book fair, we have raised a reward of over £1,000 to spend on new books for the LRC.
