There are many activities that our students can get involved in that are highly beneficial and help develop these vital employability skills. They are also fun, help develop stronger friendship circles and are great for their well-being. They will work with people from a varied career background and can ask lots of questions and network. These positive experiences are excellent for their personal statements and for their curriculum vitae.



START Profile

All our students can access the START Profile careers hub. They need to go on Start – Careers Information (startprofile.com) their username is their school email address and their date of birth written in this format for example 12/3/2010 is their password. Start will help them explore different job roles, different industries and employers, apprenticeships, further education and higher education. We want our students to be well-informed about their future and potential opportunities. Students can research different GCSE choices, post 16 and post 18 options.

Labour Market Information in this Area

It is important that we all know about career opportunities in this area including areas of growth and decline. We advise students to research different careers on Labour Market Humber website Home - LMI Humber It shows the industry twelve sectors and statistics for each sector so students can make an informed choice about their future career. Students can watch videos from each sector showing real life snippets of the jobs.

Driffield Youth Action Free Courses

Driffield Youth Action have a range of free courses available to students ages 11-16 throughout summer. These will give our students a great opportunity to work with industry professionals, learn new skills and build their knowledge in a specific area. The days include a free hot meal. The choice includes the following:

Drama Workshops:

Students will create a live performance and develop skills in directing, acting and working behind the scenes. It will culminate in a live performance to family and friends.

Film-Making Workshops:

Students will develop their creative skills and develop their digital media skills. There will be an opportunity to present their live screening at the end of the course.

DJ Workshops:

Students will work with DJ Methodz and use the best DJing gear and learn how to use a range of musical genres including house, techno and drum and base. This is a fantastic opportunity for students to work with one of Hull's most loved and creative DJs.

Mural and Spray Painting:

Students will work with Emma Garness who is a professional artist and mural painter. Previously she has worked with our students to create the two vast wall paintings in West Building. This is a brilliant opportunity for students to learn the skills and create their own original spray painting on a canvas. Students can book one or multiple sessions if they wish to develop their skills further.

Mindful Wellbeing:

Students can learn from a highly experienced yoga instructor methods of breathing, meditation, strategies to stay calm and focused. Students will get the chance to relax and reflect whilst doing mindful arts and crafts and learn about self-care to beat stress and anxiety. These are very useful skills which will develop their future resilience in the work place.

Humberside Police Lifestyle Summer 2022

Lifestyle has been running for 32 years and is a great summer project to get involved in. It helps build many employability skills, it forges stronger friendship groups and helps students get involved in their local community.

The idea is that children form teams of up to 5 (juniors need to be aged 10-13, seniors aged 14-18 and Youth Groups can be mixed ages from 10-18) and complete a project over the summer that seeks to improve their communities. Over the years we have had teams create food banks, develop the use of village halls for the homeless to sleep in, buses converted into mobile libraries, litter picking, car cleaning and lawn cutting. The projects are recorded in a logbook (this will be sent to the adult supervisor once registered) and are sent in for judging in September. There is an award ceremony in November for the finalists which is a brilliant and fun event. There are some amazing prizes to be won including a week in London, PGL trip to Wales, Flamingo land tickets, track days and many more.

Springboard Careers Support

As a community school we are passionate that everyone who requires careers support can access this. We work in partnership with Springboard. If your child has left school and is struggling and needs additional support throughout summer to ensure they go to their next destination then Springboard can help support them in a 1:1 programme. If you have older children then springboard can work with any young person from age 16-24 who requires careers guidance and help finding training or employment.

The Springboard programme includes 1:1 and group sessions covering a range of topics including:

- Mental toughness and well-being
- Communication skills
- Managing money
- Building self-esteem
- Building self-confidence
- How to engage with employers
- Interview skills
- CV help and guidance

The programme can be tailored to suit their needs and they can also signpost to other partners and services if required such as mental health support.

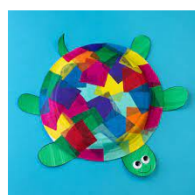
