Choosing 3 subjects

- Advantages
- Less plates to spin
- Most universities only ask for 3 grades and it appears that many more will go this way.
- Increased study time available
- Your timetable has scope to add additional options such as an EPQ

- <u>Disadvantages</u>
- You are committed to these three subjects for two years
- Reduced flexibility
- Less opportunity to accumulate points

Choosing 4 subjects

- Advantages
- Flexibility You can drop one after a year and focus on your best three areas
- You accumulate more UCAS points
- A fuller timetable.

- <u>Disadvantages</u>
- More time management
- Greater exam load
- More deadlines to meet
- Universities may not require the extra subject

The Sixth Form Day



Y12 students have 8 hours per fortnight of subjects – usually taught by at least 2 staff



There is an additional one hour per subject per fortnight, where assessed work is carried out under exam conditions



Students are expected to complete 10 hours across the year for their enrichment choice



All students have a personal tutor and will see them in the morning



Access all day to the Sixth Form Team




All post 16 establishments propose 4 hours of additional study per subject per week – 1 per subject registered in school




