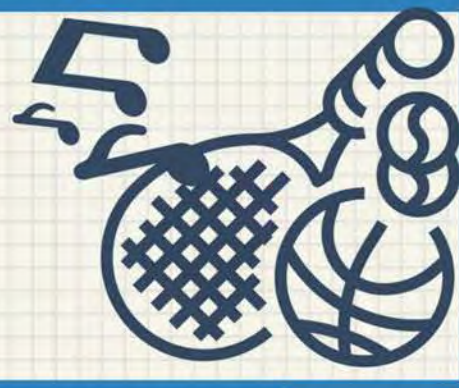

The Yorkshire Wolds was our chosen venue for the last expeditions of this calendar year. The bronze groups started at Huggate and finished at North Dalton, with a camp at Allerthorpe Lakeland Park. There were five groups undertaking their bronze assessed expedition with students from Years 10 and 11 taking part; twenty five in total. The one silver group of seven only consisted of sixth formers and they had to walk an extra day and have an extra night's camp to fulfil their expedition requirements

Carrying their packs filled with everything they needed for their expedition took more than strength; it took resilience and pure grit in some cases. A couple of occasions saw groups going in the wrong direction, but these were corrected quickly. There were several times when a few students considered whether it was too much for them, but they persevered and finished the trek.

I'm hoping that the process will help to increase my confidence, build new friendships and gain a deeper understanding of "showbusiness".

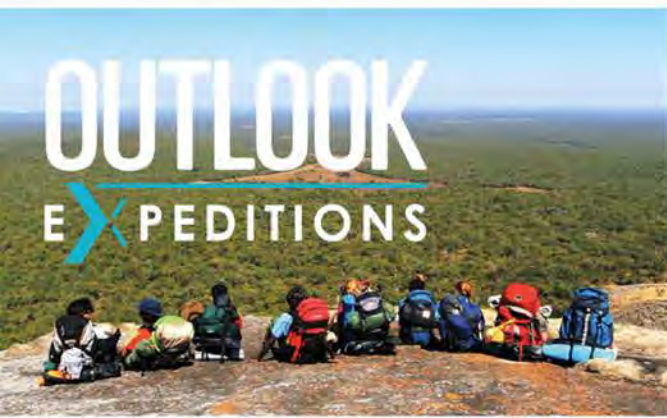
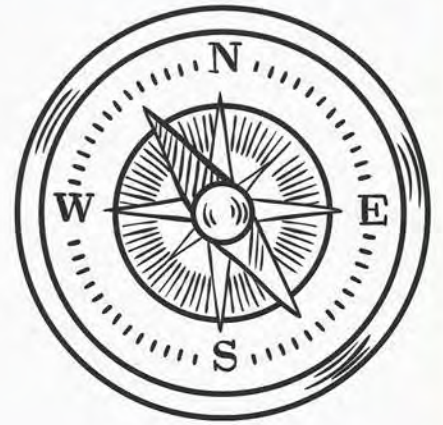

## WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

I started doing yoga after I left school at 16 and moved to London to study Performing Arts at Bird College. I found getting up and doing some yoga in the morning before a full day of dance training really helped my body warm up and prepared me both physically and mentally. Doing yoga enabled me to be injury free for my three year course at Bird College and gave me the confidence to handle nerves while auditioning for jobs

My first job was going on tour with the musical Saturday Night Fever. I did yoga every evening before the show to warm up. I went on to perform in various different musicals, ballets, TV shows and music videos for ten years. One of the final dance jobs I had was to perform at the opening ceremony of the 2012 Olympics in London. During my whole dance career I continued with yoga as a discipline; it significantly improved both my physical and mental health, building my confidence and resilience.

In 2013 after spending much of the year travelling the world as an assistant choreographer for the boyband One Direction, I decided to book a yoga teacher training course in India. I spent two months doing an intensive training course in the teaching of physical yoga, meditation, yoga philosophy and anatomy. I then set up my business and began teaching in London yoga studios, before moving to Leicestershire with my husband and two children to settle down and grow my yoga business here.

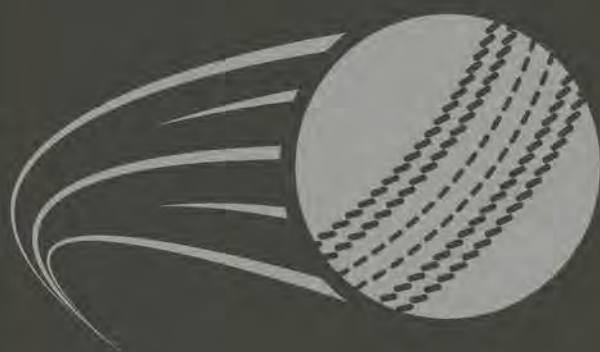
