Students have made a positive start to the new academic year; settling well into their new classes and looking extremely smart in their uniforms. We are delighted that our extra-curricular timetable has now been launched to students and we have a wide range of enrichment opportunities (both at lunchtimes and after school) that students can take part in. Our aim is to provide memorable experiences outside of the classroom that will enrich their school experience and support their personal development.

Full School Information

- An extra-curricular round up has been shared which showcases the wonderful opportunities that are on offer at Driffield School. Our extra-curricular programme is designed to provide a wide range of experiences for our young people.
- We have reminded our existing parents/carers and advised all new Year 7 parents/carers that we have a
 number of students and staff who suffer from nut and peanut allergies. Foods that contain nuts and
 peanut products, even in trace amounts, can for some of our students result in a severe allergic reaction
 which can be fatal. We ask all parents and students that products containing nuts or peanuts are not
 brought onto or consumed on our site.
- We have reminded parents/carers of our policy on the removal of jewellery for PE and Games and thank you for your continued support with this. We want to ensure that the school and lesson environment is as safe as possible for our young people.
- A letter has been shared with parents/carers from the CEO of the trust with details of the 'top up' support
 from the trust for families eligible for free school meals. In addition, because of the extra costs associated
 with Christmas, eligible families will receive an additional £5 per week per child over the two week Christmas
 break.
- Last term we carried out parental surveys to gather feedback about progress evenings and how we conduct these moving forward. As a result of this feedback, we have produced a hybrid model to ensure you have the chance to visit the school every year. We will write prior to each event with full details.
- We have a number of workshops and sessions planned for parents and carers in our community. The
 first workshop is on 21 October at 1.15 pm and there will be sessions on 'supporting your child with reading
 for pleasure' and 'supporting your child with numeracy' If any further information is needed, please contact

- There are lots of exciting extra-curricular opportunities for students this term and our Learning Resources Centre (LRC) is open to students at break and lunchtimes to give students a space to read or study independently. The LRC is also open until 5 pm on Mondays and Thursdays and all students in Years 7-9 have a fortnightly slot in their English lessons to exchange books and browse the titles available. This year we have also launched a homework club in IT1 each lunchtime which is a quiet space (with access to computers) for students to complete homework and receive support if needed. The twilight bus runs on Monday and Thursday evenings and full details can be accessed here.
