Dear Parent or Carer,

**RE: Residential visit to King's College Cambridge**

I am pleased to inform you that your child has secured a place on the residential visit to Cambridge University hosted by Driffield's partner college, King's College. It is an excellent visit and offers a great insight into life at this kind of establishment.

The visit will depart on the morning of Tuesday 28 March at approximately 8 am (TBC) and return on Wednesday 29 March between 5.30 pm and 7 pm (depending on traffic). Students will stay overnight in Cambridge onsite in ensuite university accommodation in the Keynes building that is part of Kings College.

On the visit our students will be part of a larger group of students from Sixth Forms across the East Riding of Yorkshire. As mentioned previously, over the two days students will be given a tour of King's College campus, be provided with advice and information about submitting an Oxbridge application, attend a sample lecture in either the Arts or Sciences disciplines, and visit the facilities of the university. We will also enjoy an evening walking tour of the city.

The trip is fully funded in terms of transport, accommodation and catering by Kings College Cambridge. Students will be provided with dinner on Tuesday and breakfast and lunch on Wednesday. They may wish to take a packed lunch with them for the journey down as we will not be arriving in Cambridge until the afternoon; alternatively, we will stop at a service station on the journey where lunch can be purchased. Students who are entitled to free school meals may arrange for a packed lunch to be provided (available upon request).

Students will need to bring a small bag with a change of clothes, nightwear, a warm coat and comfortable shoes. Students should also bring a notepad and pencil case. As we will stop at a service station on both journeys and will be in the centre of Cambridge on Tuesday evening, the students may wish to bring some money with them, although there is no requirement for this.
