Dear Parent or Carer,

**RE: Citizens UK Summit**

On Wednesday 5 July, The Education Alliance Trust secondary schools will be attending a national summit tackling sexual harassment and harmful behaviours. Your child has expressed an interest in attending and standing in support with over 1000 other students from across the country in driving change.

Due to the location of the summit, the day will be a long one with early departures for all schools:

Students leaving from Driffield will be required to meet at the visitor car park at 6 am ready for a 6.15pm departure. I appreciate this is a very early start. We also return back to the same car park in the evening for collection.

Please note, your child will require a packed lunch providing for the journey and any additional snacks throughout the day due to the nature of journey. Students will also be required to wear school uniform for the event.

Young people across 10 national Academy Trusts from the south coast to north Yorkshire have been working together for the last year on tackling sexual harassment and harmful behaviours. We have talked about our collective experiences, in and out of school, and have shaped our thoughts about what needs to change for us to have a better future.

We're now ready to share our thoughts, hopes and proposed solutions with those that can make a difference. It's time to turn words into actions and commitments. Over 1000 young people will convene for our final summit on Wednesday 5 July at the

University of Worcester Arena, Hylton Road, Worcester WR2 5JN from 12 noon – 2 pm.


The Summit will be in three parts:

- Part 1 will celebrate the work we have already done and what we've achieved and changed in our schools and trusts.
- In Part 2 we'll agree our collective responsibilities to continue with this essential work in our schools and trusts, and our leaders will sign a group Charter. Here, we'll also have a call to action, and negotiate with national changemakers to drive change and improvement.
- In Part 3 we'll move to considering the future and how we might build accountability into the system going forward.
