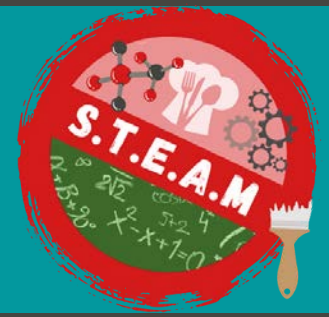

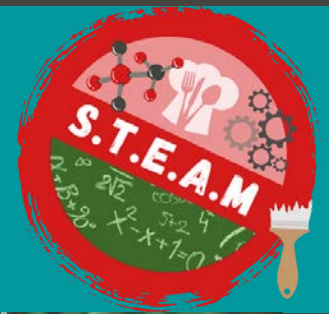
## SCARBOROUGH STEM VISIT

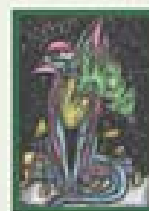

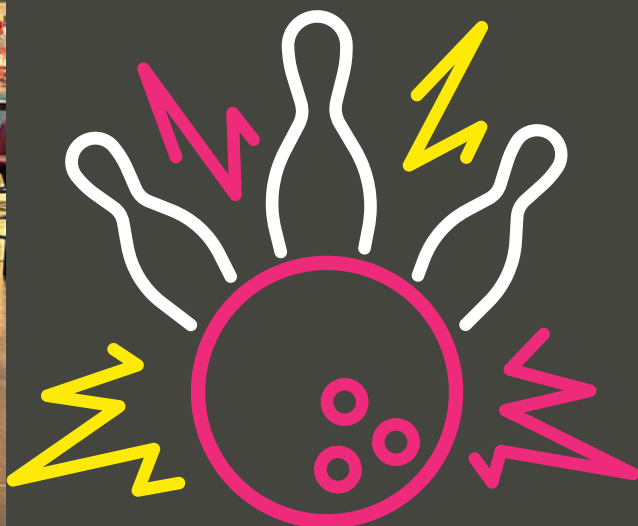
## PANATHLON

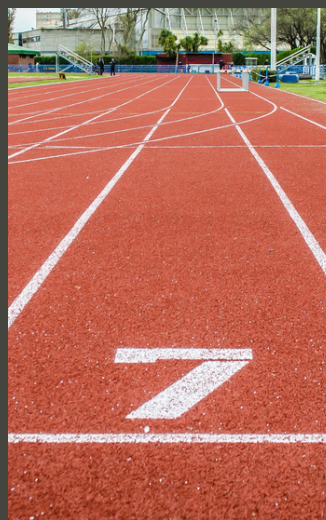
